Parking in Amsterdam for 6 euro per 24 hours inclusive of free public transport

P+R (Park&Ride) is the best place to park for visitors to Amsterdam. These are car parks on the outskirts of the city where it is easy to transfer to public transport. You can be in the centre of Amsterdam within half an hour. Parking in a P+R car park costs € 6,00 per 24 hours, and includes free public transport tickets for a maximum of five people. At the Olympic Stadium and Sloterdijk P+R you can also opt for two loan bicycles.

You can find these Amsterdam P+R locations by means of the P+R signs along the A1, A2, and the A10 ring road. During major events in the Arena and the Olympic Stadium these two car parks are only available to visitors with parking permits for that event, in which case the P+R is not or very limited available. Traffic control signs will then direct you to other P+R locations. Otherwise all locations are open seven days a week, 24 hours per day* and are supervised by a car park attendant.

* NB: Access to P+R Bos and Lommer is from 7:00 to 22:00 hours only. You can drive out 24 hours per day.

Amsterdam: accessible and livable

The City of Amsterdam wants to encourage the use of the P+R facilities to maintain access to the city and improve the quality of life. By making use of P+R you too are making a contribution to a healthy atmosphere. The best solution is to visit the city by public transport instead of by car. Rules for P+R

On arrival

- 1. Collect a car park ticket as you go in.** Please don't use a credit card at the entrance, it does not provide a P+R deduction.
- 2. Take the car park ticket to the ticket window.** The attendant will mark your card and give you a maximum of five free public transport (OV) tickets for the train (NS) or for the tram/bus/metro (GVB) or two free loan bicycles (at Sloterdijk and Olympic Stadium and only when you can show legitimate identification).
- 3. Get your GVB ticket stamped on your way in.** If you have an OV (public transport) chipcard, hold this up to the card reader when you enter or leave transport. The NS ticket has a day stamp and needs no additional stamp.
- 4. Visit the city.** Keep all your public transport tickets carefully! If you don't use your tickets or use them incorrectly, your right to a reduction will be forfeited and the normal tariff will be charged.

On leaving

- 1. Have your GVB ticket stamped on the return journey.** If you have an OV (public transport) chipcard, hold this up to the card reader when you enter or leave transport. The GVB tickets are valid for a maximum of 96 hours. The GVB tickets are not valid on night buses. The NS (rail) tickets have a date stamp which is valid until 4 a.m. the next day.
- 2. Hand in your car park ticket as well as the stamped public transport tickets or loaned bicycles at the ticket office.** The attendant will mark your car park ticket for the P+R tariff. You can only pay the attendant with a pin or credit card. Cash payments can be made in a point-of-payment terminal.
- 3. Use the car park ticket when you drive out.** The P+R tariff is good for a maximum of four consecutive days (96 hours). After 96 hours you will have to pay the normal parking tariff.
